


What's In Your Medicines?

The Summer of 2018, especially August has been brutal for recalls of medicines taken by millions of people worldwide including the US, Japan, United Kingdom (UK), European Union countries, and Canada. The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has recalled multiple recalls due to contamination of Valsartan with NDMA. N-nitrosodimethylamine (NDMA), a substance marked as a possible carcinogen based on laboratory tests, had been found in excessive quantities in the valsartan active substance manufactured by Zhejiang Huahai Pharmaceuticals. Valsartan is a 1st choice blood pressure medicine as it protects kidney function with fewer side effects and is used to treat heart failure. This is important to people with diabetes or mild kidney dysfunction. As of the week of August 26, the recall now includes 5 manufactures based in China and India for the production of the active substance in Valsartan.

The FDA also had another update on another blood pressure medicine this week. It was reported that the most prescribed diuretic blood pressure medicine, HCTZ, actually contained a totally different medicine entirely!

What to do?

- It is believed that the NDMA contamination of Valsartan has been present in generics for up to 4 years. DON'T suddenly stop taking your medicines as you coordinate with your physician and pharmacists to obtain alternatives that either do not contain the NDMA impurity or contain the correct chemical.

HEY! DID YOU KNOW?

- API = active pharmaceutical ingredient
- **EXCIPIENTS** = the inactive ingredients with no medical benefit
- Inactive ingredients in medicines such as lactose, artificial colors/dyes, and artificial sweeteners can affect your reaction to a medication.
- If you are vegan beware of LACTOSE or gelatin (pork skin source in North America) in most pill formulations. Look for vegan capsules to avoid gelatin.
- If you have dairy intolerance or lactose intolerance, avoid medicines that contain lactose (anhydrous, monohydrate or any other forms) as much as possible.
- To obtain dye-free, lactose-free over the counter NSAIDS or antihistamine allergy medicines may
 mean using dye-free children's liquid formulations. Note the dose for your age and body weight.
 ASK ASK-ASK your pharmacist for help with dosing if needed.
- Talk with your physician or your pharmacist to find the best solution for you.
- Even homeopathic and natural medicines you find at health food stores could contain inactive ingredients that are not compatible with your body.
- READ-READ-READ!! All ingredients. If you need help-ASK!
- Common Excipients that are usually plant sourced include pregelatinized starch (cooked and dried corn, potato or tapioca starch; <u>ASK if you need Gluten Free</u>), candelila wax (vegan plant based alternative to beeswax)
